TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

Know ye, That, in pursuance of the Acts of Congress appropriating and granting Land to the late Army of the United States, passed on and since the sixth day of May, 1812, *Platiah Scribner*

having deposited in the General Land-Office a Warrant in *his* favor, numbered *77.64* there is granted unto *the said Platiah Scribner* late a *private in Pop's Company 40th Regt Infantry* a certain Tract of Land, containing *the hundred & sixty acres* being the *North East 2<sup>d</sup> of Section thirty three* of Township *three south* in Range *two west* in the Tract appropriated (by the Acts aforesaid) for Military Bounties, in the Territory of *Illinois*:

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said *Quarter* Section of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Platiah Scribner* and to *his*

heirs and assigns forever.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have caused these Letters to be made patent, and the Seal of the General Land-Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my Hand, at the City of Washington, this *thirteenth* day of *June* in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and *Eighteen* and of the Independence of the United States of America the forty-*Second*.
